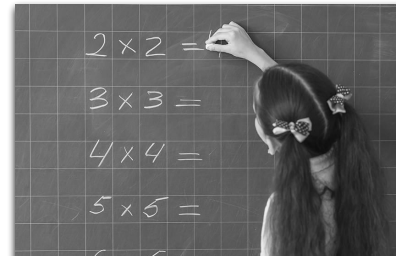


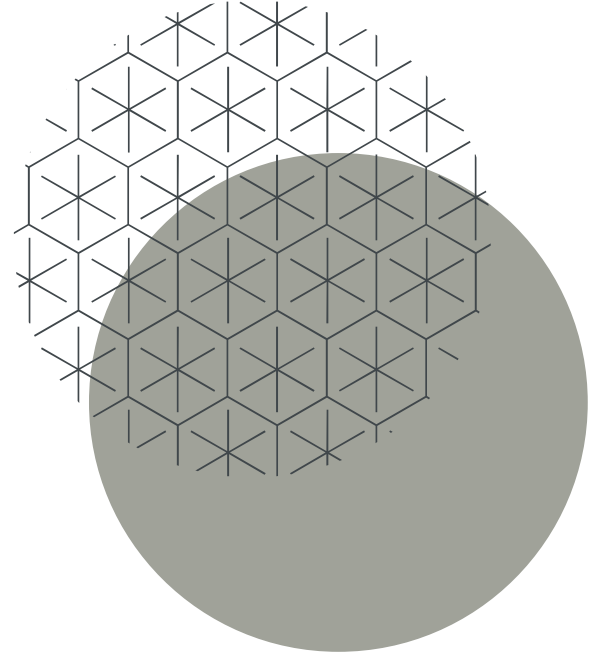
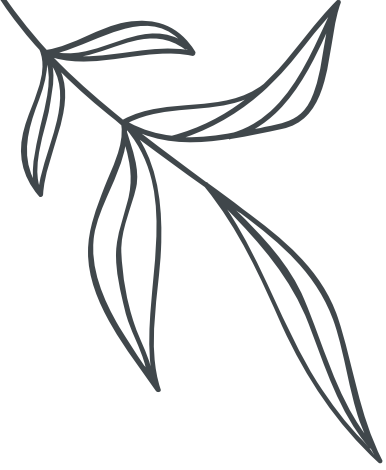
Background

In March, Governor Newsom signed AB86. As part of the bill, the California Legislature provided \$4.6 billion for statewide Expanded Learning Opportunities (ELO) Grants.

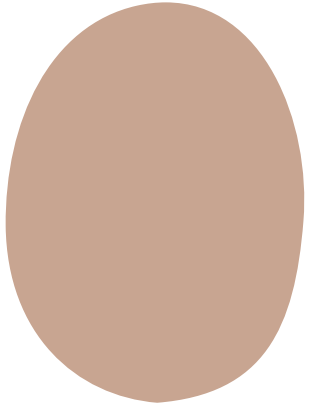
To be eligible for funding, LEAs must implement a learning recovery program that provides supplemental instruction, support for social and emotional well-being, and meals and snacks to specified student groups who have faced adverse learning and social-emotional circumstances.

The required plan will explain how the LEA will use the funds it receives through the Expanded Learning Opportunities (ELO) Grant to implement a learning recovery program for identified students.

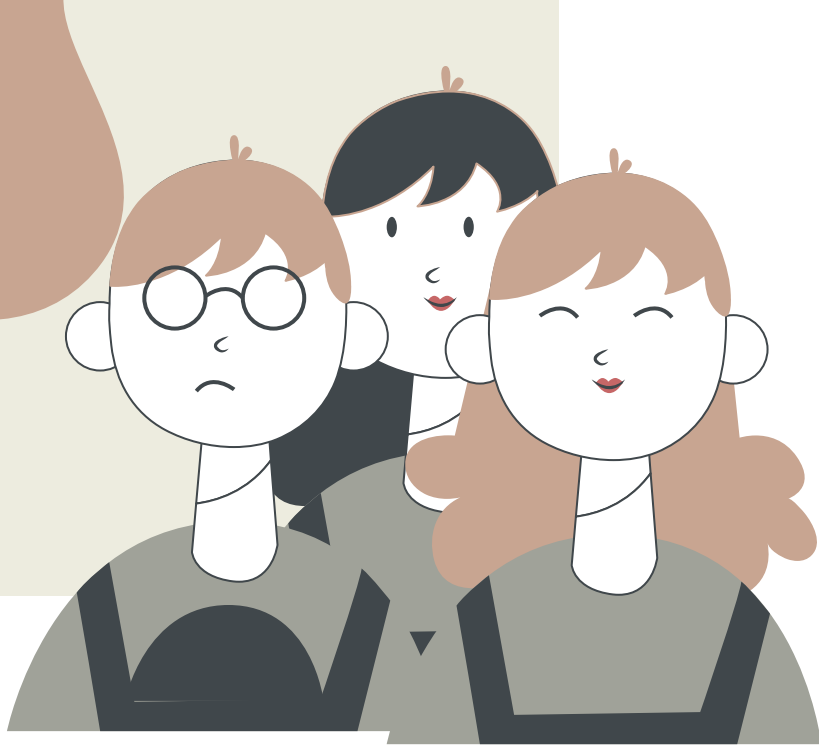

Student Groups Served by the Grant



 4. Community learning hubs
 5. Supports for credits for deficient pupils
 6. Additional academic services
 7. Training for school staff

- ★ A description of how ELO Grant funds are being coordinated with other funding sources



Proposed Budget Items for Consideration

Supplemental Instruction and Support Strategies	Planned Expenditures
Extending instructional learning time: Summer Programs & Saturday Academy	\$417,000
Accelerating progress to close learning gaps through implementation, expansion, or enhancement of learning supports: TOSAs, Lit Paras, and IAs	\$881,103
Integrated student supports to address other barriers to learning: Adaptive programs and SIPPS	\$78,000
Community learning hubs that provide students with access to technology, high-speed internet, and other academic supports: Instructional Materials, Technology, Personnel	\$166,000
Supports for credit deficient students to complete graduation or grade promotion requirements and to increase or improve students' college eligibility	N/A
Additional academic services for students: After School Tutorials	\$68,800
Training for school staff on strategies to engage students and families in addressing students' social-emotional health and academic needs: GLAD, SIPPS, SEL, Parent Trainings	\$229,240
Total Funds to Implement Strategies	\$1,840,143
