

Dear Bellevue Union School District Families and Staff,

We are dedicated to creating a safe environment and are very eager to get our students back into our buildings. To this end we have been working diligently and anxiously awaiting the opportunity to provide in-person learning as quickly as possible when deemed to safely return to our schools.

Our goal from the beginning as we look toward returning to an in-person learning model has been to provide a guaranteed and viable curriculum, which means maximizing the quantity and quality of instructional time. We recognize our educators have been working hard to provide a quality educational program under the "distant learning" model; however, we believe in-person learning has so much more to offer; including the social-emotional component that can be so challenging in a distance learning model. As we examined the "hybrid" models the largest drawback is it limits direct instructional time. In fact, depending on the model and schedule, distance learning and hybrid models significantly decreases the amount of direct instruction time (up to 70% loss) compared to the direct instructional time a student received in the traditional model (before the pandemic). Why the concern regarding instruction time? The first and foremost importance is based on years of research that if we want to eliminate inequality we must provide a guaranteed and viable curriculum. This means we need to insure we have strong, engaging explicit direct instruction. The second non-negotiable approach to a quality education is the social-emotional connection between the teachers, staff and students. The simple truth is we need to capture the heart before the mind. This is so true as we can all think back to our own school experiences as most people would agree they remember the teachers who cared and believed in them. This close personal connection is very difficult to do over a flat screen as compared to in-person. Possible, yes, much easier in-person. With these two factors in mind, our school district community has been actively engaged to create a solid educational program as we move back into the classrooms.

The challenge is to create a model that maximizes direct instructional time while we will be restricted to smaller groups/class sizes. These factors required us to think differently than others. Across the nation we recognize some students have thrived and others have dived under distance learning. Offering a hybrid with only a few hours a day of direct instruction for students will contribute to a greater loss of the opportunity to learn. Our paradigm shift in the approach to in-person learning has allowed us to create a model which we believe will greatly accelerate our students' learning. At this time we would like to share with you this plan.

We are excited to present this model at an upcoming special board meeting to be held either this Tuesday or Wednesday night (tba on Monday). We will also hold informational town hall meetings for parents in the coming weeks to provide additional information for our parents as well as additional meetings with our staff as we get closer to opening our doors once again to our students.

Rest assured we will have the safety precautions in place, to address the concerns of both staff and families. These details are being finalized and will be published separately in our Covid-19 Safety Plan.

The question I believe we have all been waiting for is... when are our students coming back to our schools? The answer rests on many factors outside of our control. Rest assured we will be ready. A great deal of details will be coming your way in the next few weeks!

Bellevue Elem: The Electrical/HVAC Upgrade was awarded and the project is scheduled to begin March 1st. Kawana Springs: We are working with our architectural firm to perform preliminary structural analysis to confirm how best to provide the much needed expansion of our Kitchen, MPR and remodel of our Admin areas.

In addition to these milestones we continued this week to make progress on preparations for the reopening of schools, finalizing the District Comprehensive Safety Plan & the planning required to perform YEAR 2 projects from our <u>BUSD Facility 5 Year Plan</u> at our other sites.

Annual Financial Audit: The District's Audit of its FY 2019/2020 Financials is on track to be completed by Christy White and Associated and will be presented to the Board of Trustees on March 9, 2021.

2nd Interim Report and Cash Flow Updates: The District will likewise be presenting its 2nd Interim financial report covering the period between July 1, 2020 through January 31, 2021, at the Board Meeting Scheduled for March 9, 2021. This report will include the most up to date Cash Flow Projections.

Governor's Proposed Budget: On January 8, 2021, the Governor released his proposed State Budget for the upcoming 2021-2022 fiscal year. Governor Newson's State Budget focused on the impacts related to the COVID-19 pandemic along with a push to safely reopen schools. Some of the major 2021-22 budget components include: (1) funding for in-personal instruction grants, expanded instructional time, and educator professional learning; (2) a 3.84% compounded COLA, applied to LCFF base grant in 2021-22 and 1.5% COLA for other programs; and (3) funding to eliminate the on-going deferrals scheduled for February 2022 through May 2022. Important to note, Cash Deferrals for 2020-21 remain in place as scheduled.

Tax Revenue Anticipation Note (TRANS): Due to the State Cash Deferrals taking place in the current fiscal year, the District has partnered with the Sonoma County Office of Education and the firm, Governmental Financial Strategies, to evaluate the need for a Tax Revenue Anticipation Note. In the event that the District is unable to close the fiscal year with a positive unrestricted cash balance in its General Fund, the District may need to borrow from future property tax revenue to meet its financial obligations.

2nd Round of ESSER (Learning Loss Mitigation Funding): A second round of ESSER funds was approved by Congress in December 2020 and funding will be disbursed to LEAs based on Title I allocations. While official details have not yet been released, we anticipate that the ESSER II funds will not be disbursed until the 2021-22 fiscal year.

New student registration is open both <u>online</u> and hard copy packets available at the school sites. Students eligible for kindergarten are 5 years old on or before September 1, 2021. Students turning 5 years old September 2 through December 2, 2021 are eligible for TK (transitional kinder). Depending on space we may accept students born December 3rd through March 1 to what we call TK plus. To register you will need a copy of the birth certificate, proof of residence (PG&E or water bill, lease), immunizations, physical and dental exam. Please call your school office with any questions.
